About Our School

Black Mountain Adult School is a very small school located in the foothills of Fresno County providing Adult Basic Education, High School Diploma, a Parenting Class, and a Beginning Welding course that is offered two times each year.

Student Profile

Students participating in our programs are from all walks of life, all ages, backgrounds, working towards their own personal education goals. Students are able to work at their own pace, allowing some to accelerate their personal education goals, and others to take longer to meet their goals if needed. Transition Specialists or Career Counselors meet with all students to assure students are made aware of all resources available to them, including an individualized transition plan designed just for them so they are ready for their next step when finished at Black Mountain. Specialists are available for consultation for students under 22 who have an IEP or 504 plan.

Number of Students

High School Diploma and Adult Basic Education courses are taught one-on-one, or in small groups of five or fewer students. Beginning Welding has no more that 20 students in each course.
